



CLOUDSTARS activities during the first months of the project

The CLOUDSTARS project started on January 1, 2023, and during the first months, our researchers have performed 17 secondments to exchange their knowledge and experience in the fields of cloud computing and artificial intelligence technologies. The favorite destinations so far are IBM Watson, with 11 secondments hosted, followed by IBM Zurich with 4 and IBM Israel with 2. To date, the CLOUDSTARS project has allowed a total of 1,145 days of stay at these host institutions.

The project remains committed to actively disseminating its findings and knowledge both within the research community and industry. So some of the most important dissemination activities where the partners have spread the project have been: Second International Workshop on Serverless Computing Experience 2023 (WOSCx2), International Conference on Performance Engineering (ICPE' 23), CCGRID 2023, Mobile Word Congress 23, International Conference on Computing Frontiers (CF '23), IEEE International Conference on Distributed Computing Systems (ICDCS 2023), RISC-V Summit Europe, 6th CompSys Conference on Computer, SURF Netwerkdag, EU Edge-Cloud-IoT Consortium and Oxford e-Research Center Talk, among others.
